SEA TILTS PLANE, 2 CHILDREN MISSING

Pan American Airliner From Miami Makes Crash Landing in San Juan Harbor

MIAMI, Fla., Oct. 3 (\mathcal{P}) — Pan American Airways said tonight that a Miami-to-San Juan seaplane "water-looped' on landing at San Juan, Puerto Rico, today and that two babies were missing in the complement of twenty-one passengers.

The infants, a Pan American spokesman said, were Marie and Zuzzie Russo, who boarded the plane with their mother, Mrs. Angelina Russo, at Port au Prince, Haiti. There was a possibility the babies might have been rescued by a small boat that had not yet reported to authorities.

All six crew members of the clipper, which did not sink, were saved. Pan American said the plane apparently swung around on hitting the water, but there were no serious injuries among the rescued passengers.

Mrs. Russo suffered from nervous shock, and her brother, Serrales, whose first name was unavailable, received a slight head injury.
